

TOWN OF GIBRALTAR ORDINANCE
RE: USE OF FISH CREEK BATHING BEACH
ORDINANCE NO. 2019-03

The Town of Gibraltar does hereby, in accordance with the Wisconsin State Statutes, enact this Ordinance. This Ordinance replaces all prior ordinances that are in any way in conflict with this Ordinance.

1. **PURPOSE.** To regulate the use of the Fish Creek bathing beach and adjacent park and parking area, located on Main Street (State Trunk Highway 42) in the Town of Gibraltar, Door County, Wisconsin, in furtherance of public order and to prevent a public nuisance.
2. **USE OF PARK.** The park, parking area and beach area shall be open to the public from 6:00 A.M. until 10:00 P.M. until 6:00 A.M. the next morning.
3. **CONDUCT IN PARK.** No person shall camp, litter, cook or have any open flames in the park, parking area or beach area.
4. **INTOXICATING LIQUOR AND FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGES PROHIBITED.** No person shall bring any intoxicating liquor or fermented malt beverages into the park, parking area or beach area after 10 PM when the park is closed.
5. **PETS PROHIBITED.** No person shall bring any pet or domestic animal into the park or beach area.
6. **VIOLATIONS.** Anyone who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00, together with the costs of prosecution. Action shall be taken as authorized in Chapter 823, Chapter 66 and any other applicable Wisconsin Statute. Each day of a violation shall be considered a separate and distinct violation. In addition, anyone who violates any provision of this Ordinance may be subject to immediate ejection from the park and may re-enter the park only when the violation complained of no longer exists.

The foregoing ordinance shall be and hereby is adopted and shall become effective upon passage and publication.
