- Bratt Road Access to property from Sugar Bush Ln: The Bratt family would like to gain access to their

- found the two properties that are to the west of the Bratt property have a 33' easements on their
- deeds, allowing the town the ability to extend the roadway to the east and to the front of the Bratt
