Carried, Selenica abstained. 17 18 **Committee/Commission Reports:** Parks & Lands: Buske reported Weed Warriors is June 12<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM. Will be conquering Dames 19 Rocket. Playground is installed at the beach. A grant was received for phase 2 that includes the soft 20 surface. The FOG event planted 20 new swamp oaks in the park. For the service project the kids 21 22 mulched trees in the parks. 23 Fire Department/EMR: No report. 24 Law Enforcement: Chief Roesch reported he completed a WPS grant for \$2000. Received a 25 scholarship from the Office of Justice Assistance for training in Las Vegas, fully funded. Speed 26 trailer is out on Spring Rd. Drone was deployed for a fire on Juddville Rd. 27 VFC: Lancaster reported they are fully staffed and open daily. Her office day is Tuesday. Member 28 social went really well, with over 100 members. 29 Noble House: Buske reported the new exhibit opened Memorial Day weekend. Had a few pop-30 ups. Uncovering headstones will be the first program in Juddville Cemetery. Will be bringing back 31 docent led walking tours around town. FOG 5<sup>th</sup> graders were able to come through the museum. 32 Applied for a grant to fix the porches. Did not get it, but received \$1000 for materials. 33 **Airport:** No report. Watershed: Thyssen reported the Fish passage has been operating as expected. Rocks and sticks are 34 35 being placed in the Fish passage. Chief Roesch has spoken with the DNR. FOG event went very 36 well. Continuing to monitor the Creek. **Planning Commission:** Public Informational meeting was held on May 30<sup>th</sup> for the Comp Plan. 37 Another one will be on June 13<sup>th</sup> at 6 PM. BLRP will be there with storyboards. The 28-day review 38 of variance for the Bayside was reviewed. Public Hearing to approve the Comp Plan is June 20th. 39 Harbor Commission: Harris reported the dock has been very busy. Nicest Memorial Day in 40 41 decades. Fully staffed for the season. A lot of maintenance was done this spring. Concrete work around the fuel pumps is complete. Will be adding 2 dinghy racks on concrete pads. - Plan Commission Recommendation Re: Bayside Petition for Grant of Variance: Thyssen provided an overview of the variance request. The Plan Commission recommends support. The benefit to the community
- outweighs the encroachment as it has improved the historical and aesthetic character of the Town. Part of the
- 29 Comprehensive Plan is to preserve our historical buildings. The property has physical limitations. It doesn't 30 have a negative effect on public interests, adhering to the ordinance would cause unnecessary hardship.
- 31 Motion: (Birmingham, Merkel) to recommend support of the petition for grant of variance. Carried.

- Consider Lowering Speed Limit on Gibraltar Bluff Rd to 25 MPH: Police Chief Roesch completed a
- 34 traffic study on Gibraltar Bluff Rd. Lowering the speed limit to 25 MPH has been requested by a resident.
- 35 Chief Roesch's study supports the request.
- 36 Siobhan Hecker would like to see it lowered to 25 MPH.
- 37 Robert MacDonald also supports the 25 MPH speed limit.
- 38 Birmingham thinks that all the way to Peninsula Players Rd from Orchard is unreasonable, suggests keeping it
- 39 30 MPH in that section.
- 40 Merkel more concerned for public safety.
- 41 Rick Hecker stated need to consider foot and bike traffic for the whole road.
- 42 Motion: (Merkel, Selenica) to set the speed limit to 25 MPH per DOT approval. Carried.
- 43 Motion: (Merkel, Selenica) to amend ordinance 2022-30 Speed Limits Identified. Carried

- 45 Consideration of Highland Rd Bid: The County Hwy Dept submitted an estimate to pave Highland Rd
- 46 North. The Town shares this road with the Village of Ephraim. The Town share would be \$33,725. Treasurer
- 47 Cain-Bieri stated the Town has received additional revenues to complete the project.
- 48 Motion: (Birmingham, Merkel) to accept the estimate from Door County Huy Dept to complete Highland Rd. Carried
